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
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
## BACKGROUND

For most Chinese, "autism" may still be a very strange word. Autism, also known as "Autism Spectrum Disorders", is a complex group of neurodevelopmental Disorders that result from brain Disorders. The cause of the disease has been widely discussed, the disease covers a wide range of manifestations are also different. It is characterized by lack of social interaction/communication, difficulty in applying learned skills, severe lack of self-regulation, and strangely rigid and repetitive behavior, and sensitivity to sensory stimuli. Autism is often accompanied by mental retardation, seizures, hyperactivity, withdrawal and other mood disorders.



## PROBLEM HIGHLIGHTED

#### **1. Growing Population**

the population of people with autism spectrum disorder is becoming larger and larger, there are 14 billion autistic people in China and that number is growing at a rate of 10 percent a year, autism spectrum disorder has become the most common form of childhood mental illness.

#### 2. Lack of Awareness

Facing such a large population, surprisingly most people do not know much about it, and more than 80% do not know about it.

#### 3. Misconceptions

There are too many misconceptions about the autistic group in the society,

which makes them subject to all kinds of discrimination.

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# Why I choose this topic?

I have a cousin with autism, and I have seen firsthand how difficult their lives are, and how much discrimination they have experienced. But everything is getting better. Since he went to the Goldenwings Art Rehabilitation Service Center for Disabled Children, my cousin fell in love with painting. Through painting, he found some confidence, and his symptoms also improved a little. Although there is no cure for autism, some relief in symptom may seem like clutching at straws. I've seen so many of these kids at Goldenwings, who are healing their minds and alleviating their symptoms through art. As a designer, I hope to help them with my little power, tell their stories to the public and improve the social awareness of autism.

Art rehabilitation is a form of therapy of combination of art and psychology, can help reduce stress, physical, mental and psychological relaxation and health, training hand-eye coordination and integration of limb motor nerve, to stimulate the brain cognitive function, inspire children's creativity and imagination, promote the self-ex-ploration, strengthen the concept of self and improve self-esteem, Soothe the symp-toms of physical and mental diseases, adjust the traumatic experience, improve the development of insight, enjoy the fun of artistic creation.

Through regular visits to the Goldenwings twice a week, I have established a relatively good relationship with parents and their manager. Through interviews, I have learned about parents' caring pressure and their thoughts and expectations on their children's current situation. Conducted in-depth interviews with four parents.

# **Problem Framing**

**Research Goal:** Understand more challenges the autism group are facing.

Participants: Parents, students and staff of Goldenwings

#### Insights/What I found:

- Autistic parents are under huge pres– sure, they want to live one day longer than their children, or they even want to take their children with them when they die.
- There are a lot of misconceptions about the autistic community in society.
- They have language barriers, but they can still understand emotion and meaning of the dialogue.

He works as a poster designer in a bookstore and he likes playing basketball, saxophone and also painting. His paintings have been exhibited in the National Center for the Perform Arts. Even like him, he still receives discriminations from sociey.

# Prototype

#### About Prototype

After I interviewing and observing in the Goldenwings Art Rehabilitation Service Center For Disabled Children I tried out few path to gathering the idea of providing the people with autism a better future, including help them enhacing their vocational skills, communication skills, cognitive ability and give them cofidence to feel that they are very useful. The paths are Art Workshop and Educational Game. The main idea is that I want to explore how the concept of bringing a better future for the people with autism and which one is the most effective and acceptable approach for people with autism. " I think the workshop is very good for the students to stumilate their inspirations as well as their brain activity. 
#### Goals:


## Exhibition




A total of 54 people participated in the exhibition, including families with autism, but the rest were members of the public. According to my questionnaire survey of the participants, 85% of them are not very familiar with autism, and they are shocked that even autistic people can draw such powerful works. Of those who didn't know about autism, 90% said they had a better understanding of the condition.


## 90% thought they better understand autism
